These are available to Institutions at a subscription rate (1997) of £36.

The Scottish Ornithologists' Club was formed in 1936 to encourage all aspects of ornithology in Scotland. It has local branches which meet in Aberdeen, Ayr, the Borders, Dundrees, Dundree, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Inverness, New Galloway, Orkney, St Andrews, Stirling, Stranfare and Thurso, each with its own programme of field meetings and winter lectures. The Waterston Library at the Club's headquarters at 21 Regent Terrace, Edinburgh EH7 5BT is the most comprehensive ornithological library in Scotland, and is available for reference during office hours (Monday to Friday, 0930-1630 hrs but please phone beforehand).
